
SUPPLEMENTAL FINAL ORDER OF JUDGMENT

Having considered the Motions to Stay the case filed by Defendants Andris Pukke, Peter Baker, Luke Chadwick, and John Usher (“Defendants”), and the Post-judgment Motions filed by Defendants and Plaintiff the Federal Trade Commission (“FTC”), any oppositions and replies thereto, it is, for the reasons set forth in the accompanying Memorandum Opinion, this 24 day of March 2021,

ORDERED

1. Defendants’ Motions to Stay, ECF Nos. 1135, 1171, 1177, & 1187, are **DENIED**;
2. Defendants’ Motions for Post-judgment Relief, ECF Nos. 1134, 1138, 1169, & 1140-2, are **DENIED**;
3. The FTC’s Motion to Amend the Final Order for Permanent Injunction and Monetary Judgment Against Andris Pukke, Peter Baker, and Luke Chadwick, ECF No. 1122, is **GRANTED**;
4. The FTC’s Motion to Enter Final Order Concerning Receiver’s Control of Kanantik, ECF No. 1118, is **GRANTED**; and
5. **FINAL JUDGMENT** is hereby entered in this case pursuant to the Court’s prior orders. (This Order is intended to signal to all parties that the time for appeal from the

Court's Amended Final Order for Permanent Injunction and Monetary Judgment and Supplemental Final Order of Judgment, begins with the filing of this Order).
